Why UW Premera Rural Nursing Health Initiative (RNHI) ARNP Fellowship?



We are a network of rural primary care organizations with University of Washington School of Nursing as the centralized hub

What sets us apart...

- Program designed by nationally recognized clinicians and academicians with expertise in NP residencies & fellowships, in collaboration with fellowship site directors and preceptor faculty – *tailored to meet the needs of each fellow*
- An interdisciplinary cadre of clinicians who are dedicated to their rural practice and communities
- Learn from and with a cohort of fellows who are passionate about rural primary care – practice at full scope!

Why UW Premera Rural Nursing Health Initiative (RNHI) ARNP Fellowship?

Grant funded support

- Weekly didactic sessions (via Zoom) & hands on Skills Workshops at the Simulation Center at the UW School of Nursing in Seattle (Sept 2023 & March 2024)
- Mileage and lodging reimbursements for travel to specialty rotations
- Up to \$2,000 per fellow for primary care / rural conference attendance
- Grant-funded registration and travel to UW CNE Primary Care Conference in Seattle (October 2023)
- Access to restricted UW online library resources (access to UW Net IDs / email)
- Facilitated bi-monthly well-being sessions for fellows



Family Medicine NP Fellowship

- We are in our 2nd year of partnering with UW/Premera RHNI Grant in building our Family Medicine NP Fellowship
- We currently have 2 Fellows in our Aberdeen RHC location

- 70%+ of the patient population we serve is receiving services from Medicare and/or Medicaid.



Family Medicine NP Fellowship

- Current weekly schedule includes:
 - 3 days of Continuity Clinic
 - 1 day for specialty rotation (specialty rotates monthly)
 - 1 day of Didactic/ Community project development
 - Didactics are in partnership with the UW/Premera RHNI Grant.
 - This is a 1 year (12 month) employed Fellowship
 - We are accepting 2 Fellows for our 2023 -2024 cohort.



See the View at Hurricane Ridge

Encompassing nearly a million acres, the Olympic National Park protects a vast wilderness, thousands of years of human history, and several distinctly different ecosystems, including glacier-capped mountains, old-growth temperate rain forests, and over 70 miles of wild coastline.



Bicycle Tour the Olympic Discovery Trail

The ODT is a 130-mile route navigating the Olympic Peninsula's northern coast. Stretching from Port Townsend to La Push, the trail crosses five converted railroad trusses and navigates several postcard-worthy environments.



Paddle Off Ediz Hook

Ediz Hook is a three-mile, crescent-shaped sand spit extending from the Port Angeles shoreline. Also referred to as "the Spit" or "the Hook," this unique landform offers easy adventures from the city.

Watch for Whales

Port Angeles is a prime spot for whale sightings. And not just a single species – humpback, orca, minke, and gray whales make appearances throughout the year.





Why choose Valley View?






Federally Qualified Health Center in Lewis, Thurston and Pacific Counties in Southwestern, Washington founded in 2004

Currently we have a total of 13 clinics to include Medical, Dental, Behavioral Health, a Walk in Clinic for acute care and a pharmacy

In 2020, we served over 29,000 patients with many of these having multiple appointments

- Lewis and Pacific counties currently rank in the bottom third for social determinants of health, behavioral health risk factors, clinical care options and health care outcomes.


- Populations vary depending on clinic from loggers in Pe Ell and Toledo, to the fish factory workers in Raymond, Hispanic Farm workers in Chehalis and Centralia, the homeless population in Olympia.



- Focused on Rural and Underserved Populations
- Outreach clinic to the Homeless Population in Olympia where Fellows will spend one afternoon a week for 4-6 weeks working with these patients
- Opportunity to perform home visit with Developmentally Disabled Adults one time during the year (perhaps more depending on clinic assignment).
- Work in conjunction with Behavioral Health Resources and other outpatient resources to see outpatient SUD treatment programs in the area

1. Train in a pioneering Community Health Center founded in 1975 in a single house but now with 10 primary care locations up and down the Yakima Valley.
2. Located in Central Washington State in the fertile, agricultural Yakima Valley, YNHS serves more than 25,000 patients annually, including the sizable Latino farm-worker population.
3. Practice in a high performance PCMH model of care with high levels of integration and team-based care.
4. Unique Healthcare for the Homeless program which recognizes that housing is health care.
5. Become part of the YNHS family – a nationally recognized health center!



What distinguishes YNHS?

- Well-established Medication for Opioid Use Disorder (MOUD) program serves as national model.
- Primary care clinic dedicated to medical, dental and behavioral health needs of Veterans.
- Nutrition services, pharmacy, care coordination, mental health counselors and homeless outreach staff are co-located or within walking distance to ensure integration of all aspects of primary health care.
- Dedicated resource center for LGBTQ+ youth.
